OFFICER REPORTS

<u>President's Report</u>: None this month.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: Continue to have above normal office supply expenses, Perry is following up with Hawthorne about that- apparently we are required by law to mail certain mailings to homeowners. Perry confirmed that Hawthorne has transferred to reserves \$6,666.66 for January and February in alignment with our monthly allocations. Our pool contract fees were due March 1 and have been paid.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

<u>Landscaping</u>: Bob confirmed with Pike's Nursery for installation this spring at the monuments. <u>Pool</u>: Pool contract was paid out for March 1, paid for pool license.

<u>Social</u>: Spring Yard Sale scheduled for April 22. April 1 Easter event. Social Committee has 3 volunteers consistently and 3 additional ad hoc volunteers, fully staffed for the year.

- 2. Property Violations
 - a. Process- First notice of violation(s), homeowner has 30-days to correct, 2nd notice to homeowner, 1 to 2-weeks to correct, then final notice and if not resolved by the homeowner escalates to a hearing. Oftentimes homeowners do not appear at the hearing. Once a house escalates to being fined, another department (not Candice) handles that.
 - b. Do the homeowners know they're getting fined? Candice will confirm repeatedly fined homeowners receive letters with each fine.
