

NEVER pay for any work until it is completed entirely. NEVER pay him up front to purchase supplies!

Your best bet is to check a service such as Angie's List and hire someone who comes highly recommended. Paying a little bit more may be well worth it in the end!

AND REMEMBER there is a no-soliciting law in Huntersville. If you are in doubt call 911.... Let the HPD determine whether they have a right to solicit in our community.



The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM and the previous Minutes were adopted.

<u>President's Report</u> – Kevin LaValley stated that with the agreement of the Board, Suzanne Russell will assume the role of Treasurer. Ray Kudlak will continue as Secretary.

<u>Hawthorne Mgt. report</u> – **Barrie** reported that Collection Letters are being sent to 14 owners for nonpayment of 2014 dues. An additional 3 properties have been liened and 3 others are on re-payment plans. One property owner will be called to a hearing in June.

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

Cedarfield Plantation (CI) Monthly Board Meeting (MAY)

Attendance: Julie Taylor, Dave Rosen, William Saran, Gigi Glass, Margaret Doherty.

Meeting called to order at 6:30pm and meeting was adjourned at 10:05pm. (Next Meeting: June 18th)

Homeowner Comments:

Several homeowners requested clairification of the new pool policy by the Board.

Treasury / Financial Report:

Hawthorne Management provided an overview of the April Financial Statement / update of the delinquencies/violations reports.

Completed Projects / Items:

The Board held a special meeting with the community on May 6th to discuss the extensive freeze damage, the repairs to the pool house and the possibility of a remodel to the pool house.

The Board worked with the Pool Company to complete a list of items necessary to obtain a permit from Mecklenburg County to open the pool for the 2014 season.

The Board worked with a contracting company to have the pool deck drains cleaned/repaired, the pool deck pressure washed, repairs in other bathrooms including temporary closure of the shower areas, additional shower added to outside area and enclosure of the electrical panel in pump room; all work was completed prior to the pool opening.

The change to all light fixtures at monuments and accent lighting along the landscaping at front entrance is complete.

The new pool policy was approved and mailed to the homeowners along with their new pool fob.

The installation of lights along the pool house drive by Energy United is complete.

The installation of the new pool key fob system is complete and will add additional door locations in the future.

The installation of Phase 2 for the shrubs/trees along Stratton Farm Parkway including the monument areas is complete.

The installation of WIFI along with the addition of new signs at pool area is complete .

The Town of Huntersville completed modifications to the front grass areas on both sides of the road to improve drainage from McCoy Rd/Stratton Farm to the pool house drive.

Outstanding Items:

The Board is still working with our insurance company and contractors to review options for the repairs of the extensive freeze damage to the pool house.

The Board is working with the Town of Huntersville and Mecklenburg County to determine items that are needed to obtain permits for the possible remodel of the pool house.

The Board has met with several contractors to discuss the possible remodel of the pool house.

An analysis and repair of the irrigation system is currently in progress.

The addition of small trees on the left side of Stratton farm is pending due to the delay of the irrigation repairs.

Additional repairs are needed for the irrigation system due to the damage during the installation of the pool house drive lighting.

The Board approved money to have the trees at Twin Trail pruned, pool house drive and at pond area; project to begin in June.

The Board approved money to repair electrical and add new light fixture at the McCoy / Twin Trail Cedarfield sign.

The Board will work with Landscape Company to set up a fertilizer treatment for the oak trees down the pool house drive.

The Board agreed to design new signs to be placed in all marquee locations.

The Board is in discussions to move the marquee board in the island of Twin Trail to a more visible area.

The Welcome Committee is in progress to create a "Welcome Packet" for all new homeowners in Cedarfield.
