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### **Annual Springtime Home Maintenance Reminders:**

Spring will be here before you know it! With that said, it's time again for all Cedarfield residents to inspect their properties and ensure their homes are being maintained properly in accordance with our community's governing documents. Maintaining the exterior of our homes including the land-scaping is the responsibility of each homeowner and includes:



- <u>Landscape Maintenance.</u> Grass, hedges, shrubs, vines and mass planting of any type on any lot or any portion of the project shall be kept trimmed and shall, at regular intervals, be mowed, trimmed and cut so as to appear neat and attractive. Trees, shrubs, vines and plants which die shall be promptly removed. Edge around sidewalks, curbs and driveways and remove weeds growing in the cracks of driveways.
- <u>Painting</u>. Exterior surfaces should be repainted as needed, including shutters and doors. Sun exposure will prematurely fade paint on exterior siding, windows, shutters and doors. Homeowners wishing to repaint their home a different color than what was originally painted should seek prior approval from the Association.
- <u>Pressure Washing.</u> Certain sides of homes get moldy and dirty very fast due to lack of sunlight. Please maintain these areas by pressure washing at minimum annually. This should include the removal of mold from all surfaces including decks and masonry surfaces.
- <u>Mailboxes, Outdoor Lighting.</u> Ensure outdoor lighting and mailboxes are maintained and in good working order. Replace bulbs and broken fixtures regularly. As necessary, aging mailboxes should also be reviewed for repairs and/or replacement. Homeowners seeking to replace their mailbox with something other than what was originally installed are required to submit an architectural request prior to any changes.
- **Roofs**. As our community is now 25+ years old, roofs should be checked regularly to ensure that they are in good repair. Damage to roofs due to storms should be repaired immediately.
- <u>Driveways.</u> Driveways should be free of oil stains and pressure washed if necessary. They should also be clear of any clutter.
- <u>Hoses, Garden Tools, Etc.</u> Garden hoses and other garden tools or materials should be stored neatly at the rear of homes, out of view from the street. Planters should be maintained and contain living plants.
- Exterior Improvements. Please note that any homeowner seeking to make any exterior alterations or improvements to their home or lot should submit an application to be reviewed and approved by the homeowners association prior to any work being performed.

The Board of Directors and Hawthorne Management Company will continue conducting inspections of our community; however, residents with homes that are determined to have specific maintenance issues or problems will be notified by mail and given specific timeframes to correct and repair the identified maintenance issues with their residence. If specific issues are not resolved within the specified timeframes, the Board will unfortunately be calling those homeowners to hearings. 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

### CEDARFIELD PLANTATION HOA BOARD MEETING

### Call Meeting to Order: 7:00 P

#### **Meeting Minutes**

[December] Board Meeting minutes were reviewed and approved.

Motion made by Julie to select new officers. Second by Bill. Motion PASSED and new officers are as follows:

President: Kirk Deverick Vice President: Bill Sarantis Treasurer: Gigi Glass Secretary: Lisa Deverick

Board Member at Large: Julie Taylor

Old Business:

It was discussed whether or not to proceed forward with collecting back dues from resident on Cliff Creek (as house is in foreclosure) and steps necessary to do so.

### New Business:

- Item 1 To audiotape meetings for the purpose of accurate minutes by the secretary beginning with January meeting. Motion by Lisa to accept proposal. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Julie. Motion PASSED (5-0).
- Item 2 It was discussed whether or not to prune the crepe myrtles by the pool. It was decided unanimously to NOT prune the trees down, but to only trim the trunks to keep them looking neat.
- Item 3- Additional Insurance claim for mold and rot in the pool house was denied. However, the claim stated that the survey was not a comprehensive survey and that nonintrusive techniques were used. Bill scheduled a Public Insurance Adjuster to meet the board members after the meeting, and to open the walls to see all damage. If the adjuster feels that there is a viable claim, then he can help us file a new claim. If money is obtained from the insurance company, the adjuster would collect 10% of settlement.
- Item 4- Violations. Discussion to keep consistency regarding violations in the neighborhood. Chris/HMC provided a Violations Identification Guideline. After reading through the guideline it was motioned by Kirk to accept the guidelines with provisions to take each violation into considera-

tion ie: additional time allotted to correct violation, when the actual drive through will occur, etc). The board requested a list of violations within 7 days of drive through by HMC. Kirk made a motion to adopt these guidelines with aforementioned provisions, 2nd Julie. Motion PASSED (5-0)

Item 5- Pool, Pumps, and building.. Goal is to repair or replace pool pumps and repair pool house mold and rotted wood, and to have the pool open for Spring 2015. NC law states that is is our duty and responsibility to maintain and upkeep all existing structures in our neighborhood common areas. It will cost \$7500 to replace the system.

Kirk motioned to place that \$7500 expenditure on hold to see if we can get replacement motors for the pumps by using the warranty on it (warranty expires in March). However, if the required flow rate cannot be met, then the replacements would need to be purchased. 2nd by Bill. Motion PASSED (5-0)

Item 6- It was suggested to bring in 2 or more architects to evaluate, Give comprehensive plans, and to place bids for work/repairs to be done. All board members should be present.

A comprehensive plan should include, but is not limited to: examine pool shell, examine pumps, evaluate existing damage to pool house, give expert opinion on repairs and/or converting building to include a meeting/multi-purpose room. Kirk motioned to begin the process by getting an architect to evaluate and give a comprehensive plan. Evaluation is NOT to exceed \$5000. 2nd by Julie. Motion PASSED (5-0)

Item 7- Discussion to gather information and promote information regarding our neighborhood via internet technology. Kirk will research options.

Next Board meeting scheduled for Monday, February 9th at 7:00pm
