

CEDARFIELD PLANTATION HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION BOARD MEETING MINUTES – REGULAR SESSION Date: Wednesday, June 13, 2018

Location: Cedar Management, 9500 Statesville Road, Charlotte, NC

Board Attendees: Ben Barbour, Devin Biery, Christy Cowan, Daniel Spencer, Zee Stracener

CMG Attendee: Tracey Griffin

Motion with second to ratify April 18th and May 16th Regular Session Minutes; all in favor. Motion passed. All May Action Items from the May meeting have been completed.

Finance Report:

We still have an outstanding balance owed to us by homeowners of approximately \$33,000. Please pay your dues!

- The board agreed that we should send a mass email to homeowners regarding specific pool rules, including "no fob, no entry", "respect lifeguards", "emergency exits only to be used for emergencies".
- Our reserves are at \$112,000. A portion of that will be used to take care of the leylands on Stratton Farm Road between the pool road and Cedar Fall Drive, on the pool side of the road.

Committee Reports:

Architectural - No update. The committee is current on all requests.

Landscaping

- Trees to replace leylands that we are having removed We currently have 2 quotes, but still need more information from one of them (Superior Landscaping). The prices are similar and both are being guaranteed for a year. Ben will get back to us once he has more information.
- Irrigation Superior is working on getting this scheduled. Once this work is finished, then they will start on the new plantings at the front that we approved, and the pine needles.
- All bushes will be trimmed soon. Ben will let Superior know that the vines at the front entrances are jumping into the trees again.
- Leyland removal will be the weekend of July 21st. We need to contact homeowners who back up to these trees. Ben will be getting permits to close road and will be calling to get the utilities marked. Send a mass email sometime at the first of July informing residents of the street closure. We also need to put this information in the Sun.
- There is a tree down at the front field. Superior will be giving us a quote to remove it.
- There is a tree down behind the monument at Twin Trail Drive and Stratton Farm (McCoy side). Ben will research.
- The bushes have grown out onto the sidewalk between Twin Trail Drive and Moores Mill. As stated above, Superior will be trimming all bushes soon.

Pool

- We need a new cover for the handicap lift at the pool. Motion with second to approve the purchase of a canvas cover (cost = \$289 + tax & shipping); all in favor. Motion passed.
- We have had requests to add tables and umbrellas to the pool deck. We currently have 2 umbrellas and stands in storage and would just need tables to go with them. Zee will get more information on pricing and get back to us.
- We are currently having a problem with bees landing on the lap lane (covered by pool noodles) and stinging swimmers. Zee will contact Aquatech to see what they recommend.
- The playground equipment in need of a few items to repair some things. These items have been ordered. The swings will be reinstalled as soon as everything arrives.
- Fobs are currently being issued to residents requesting them. If you are having issues with your fob or need a new one, please go to our website and click the fob request link. www.cedarfieldplantation1.com
- Fobs on delinquent accounts have been suspended. If you have recently become in good standing with your account and want to make sure your fob is turned on, you may email <u>secretary@cedarfieldplantation1.com</u>.

Annual HOA Meeting:





Is it important to rinse your recyclables? Sure it is!!

Cardboard

Be sure to empty out that greasy old pizza box. When it makes it to the recycling plant to be sorted, it'll just be tossed into the garbage, otherwise it would contaminate an entire bail of paper. So, by leaving that dried up final slice of pizza in there, you've basically defeated the purpose of recycling it at all.

Plastic

Plastic—and what's stored in it—isn't always the easiest to clean. If that gross milk becomes solid, or if you fail to wipe out that old moldy peanut butter from the jar you found in the back of your cupboard, it may be too much trouble to clean once it reaches the recycling plant, causing it to be chucked in with the regular garbage.

Metal

The most valuable recyclable collected is used beverage containers. So if you're too lazy to pour out the remaining soda you didn't finish with your dinner, no one's going to throw it into the trash later at the recycling plant, but leaving liquids in there may contaminate other recyclables, like paper, and attract critters to the recycling plant.

Other metal containers, like steel cans, aren't quite as valuable, but they're still going to be saved and washed. If you leave a half of a can of refried beans in the can, though, the contamination issue is still going to be there, as is the increased cost of cleaning it.

Glass

Rinsing out your glass is really important. While glass may be easier to clean out than plastic, glass, in particular, has one very simple thing against it when it comes to getting recycled: Economics. See, the dirtier you leave a glass, the more it has to be cleaned and every step of that—from the sorting to the cleaning to the re-cleaning—costs money. New glass is made from sand, which, as far as raw materials go, is pretty damn cheap. So, if all this cleaning and recleaning causes recycled glass to be too expensive to bother with, people are just going to get new glass instead.

Basically this is all about economics. So while those recycling companies are doing something nice for the Earth, they're still a *business*, and they can't pay their employees with altruism.

All you need to do is rinse out that dirty container before putting it in your blue bin and you'll be doing GOOD for the earth!


