Motion with second to ratify June Regular Session Minutes; all in favor. Motion passed.

Finance Report:

We still have an outstanding balance owed to us by homeowners of approximately \$29,087. Please pay your dues!

Committee Reports:

Architectural - No report.

Landscaping

Leylands are scheduled to come down the first week of August (3rd,5th), a change from last month's meeting. Ben is still trying to figure out if we need a permit to close the road.

Replacement trees - Motion with second to approve planting Eastern Red Cedar and Cryptomeria with Superior Landscaping (she will guarantee in writing for 1 year as long as irrigation is maintained), not to exceed \$15,000. All in favor, motion approved.

Irrigation has been repaired throughout the community. Motion with second to ratify email vote to accept as needed irrigation work by pool and front areas not to exceed \$1000. All in favor, motion approved.

Pine straw was put out.

Superior Landscaping is waiting on weather to start the front monument project.

It is on Superior's maintenance list to keep vines trimmed out of trees near front at McCoy Road.

Pool

Request to have bathrooms open during adult swim hours – We will start doing this. Daniel will contact the pool committee to create the procedure for doing this.

Need to purchase edging to keep dirt off of the baby pool deck. Motion with second to approve this expenditure not to exceed \$50. All in favor, motion passed.

Request to give wifi password to residents - The board says no.

Bee update – the volleyball players have replaced the noodles on the lane line at their expense. Thank you! This has helped to keep them out of the pool. They are still active around the pool deck, as in past years. The lifeguards are spraying vinegar water to try to help with that. Daniel will look into adding signage regarding bees and making sure if you are allergic to them, that you know they are at our pool and are prepared just in case.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

- ARC Committee Nothing to report. To make an ARC request or review the ARC guidelines, please go to www.cedarfieldii.com and click on the "Documents" tab.
- Social Committee The Social Committee continues to seek additional help and participation from neighborhood residents. If interested, contact Jessica Shellenberger at jess_gillette@yahoo.com. The following are the planned summer events: Jul 13 movie at the pool; Aug 24 movie at the pool & back to school bash, 8p-10p; Sept 3 Labor day party.
- Pool Committee Kevin LaValley has worked with Swim Club Management to address the issues in the pump room. Work on the exterior shower wall to replace damaged drywall will commence after pool season. Homeowners Randy and Susie Call have volunteered to pressure wash the bathroom floors. The pool committee would like to remind all homeowners that Swim Club Management lifeguards are responsible for the enforcement of the rules approved by the HOA Board and the pool committee. The CII HOA Board reserves the right to call any resident to a discipline hearing at any time and has the authority to suspend pool privileges or fine any person(s), or those responsible for persons (i.e. guests or minors), that break these rules or acts in an extreme or obscene manner. If you see any violations of the pool regulations by residents or their guests, please let the lifeguard on duty know first then, report the issue to the CII HOA Board with specifics: (name, circumstances, and date/time).
- Landscaping Committee Kevin LaValley will follow-up with AT&T regarding the cable/phone line that has been lying on Stratton Farm Road. This will be the third contact with AT&T regarding the line. The CII HOA Board strives to keep homeowners informed of matters that affect our neighborhood. Recently, a homeowner uncovered information related to the property lines along Mcllwaine and McCoy Roads and while the information may only concern those who live adjacent to these roads, the board thought it prudent to share the findings. The research found that the property lines for homes adjacent to Mcllwaine and McCoy Roads extend to the road. There is a 50' utility easement from the center of the road to these properties and there are rules that dictate how far a fence line should be from the road. While the City of Huntersville is responsible for maintaining any sidewalks in these areas, the homeowner is responsible for the landscaping. As such, if a tree or limb falls within this area, the homeowner is responsible for the removal based on county requirements. There are also requirements for what a homeowner can and cannot do regarding tree and shrub "screening" in these areas. The CII HOA is responsible for maintaining all the corner monuments, the island on Henderson Hill Road, and the grass along Mcllwaine and McCoy Roads. Should there be any questions regarding this information, please contact a member of the CII HOA Board.
- Playground The new playground is in production with an anticipated installation within 4-10 weeks.
- Financial Report Financials remain on budget for nearly all expense categories. There is a substantial amount of assessments that are past due, which the board will aggressively address. A large expense for the refurbishing of pool furniture was moved from the pool expense category into the pool furniture expense category. June saw several expenses for the playground project which depleted the playground reserve. Even though we are on budget through the first half of the year, the CII Board is taking a hard look at all projects and only moving forward with those considered as "must do" in an order to save money in 2018.

Street captains – Addy Barton has assembled a team of volunteers who will be identified as street captains. The volunteers
will be assigned zones within CII and will work to welcome new homeowners and bring suggestions, ideas, questions






