CEDARFIELD PLANTATION HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATION BOARD MEETING MINUTES - REGULAR SESSION

Date: Wednesday, September 5, 2018

Location: Cedar Management, 9500 Statesville Road, Charlotte, NC

Board Attendees: Ben Barbour, Devin Biery, Christy Cowan, Daniel Spencer

CMG Attendee: Scott Hines

Motion with second to ratify August Regular Session Minutes; all in favor. Motion passed.

Finance Report:

Xpress Pay notices that went out to homeowners - per Scott, Xpress Pay went down for a few days. Notices went out to homeowners who tried to pay online during that time. We have complaints from homeowners about notices coming to them saying an amount is owed, but the homeowners are all paid up. Scott will look into this matter.

2019 dues will be billed in December for a January due date. Please make sure your 2018 dues are paid!

Discussed wording of late fee assessment for next year. Topic tabled until next meeting.

Committee Reports:

Architectural: All requests are up to date.

Landscaping

Krista from Superior in attendance. We noticed that the current contract is out of date. Currently, the contract has Superior coming out twice a year for pruning bushes (spring and fall). We need to add another pruning date for certain bushes that get leaders that grow out the top, particularly along the boulevard (Stratton Farm). Krista will get us an updated contract.

Monuments and islands are in need of attention. Krista's recommendation is to pull out dead bushes/plants and update with new plantings. We would need those recommendations from her when her team sees that things need to happen as we do not patrol these areas like they do. Krista recommends the Board doing a walk-thru a couple of times a year, also, so we can give our concerns and recommendations to her and her team. We asked her to please tell her team to pull up dead plants/bushes in monument areas and on corners and let us know so we can decide about replacements.

We asked that Superior make sure to put it on their radar to keep dropped limbs cleaned up (especially along McCoy Road).

Per Krista, front entrance monuments will be done when replacement trees along Stratton Farm are put in, sometime in October. Replacements will be Eastern Red Cedar and Cryptomeria. Irrigation will be laid down for this area before October. Once the planting is finished, grass seeding will happen from sidewalk to planting area.

Per Krista, aeration of pool area and boulevard will happen in September. At that time, they'll check sprinkler heads for any that need adjusting.

Discussed alternatives to pine needles. Krista said mulch is very expensive and would need to be refreshed just like needles. River rock would be a one time expense and is easily maintained, but you have to make sure it's the look you want for the neighborhood. There are ground covers that can be planted.

Still waiting on an electrical quote for replacement at the Cedar Fall monument that was taken out by the car in August. Scott will give our mason and landscaping quotes to the insurance company so they can get us a check and work can begin.

Landscaping Committee still needs members. Please contact Ben Barbour at treasurer@cedarfieldplantation1.com if interested.

Pool

Motion with second to ratify vote on pool drain expenditure. All in favor; motion passed.

Preparing for pool shut down after September 9^{th} . Most of the furniture and other items will be put away on September 22^{nd} . Winterization of pool equipment will happen shortly after.

One of our security cameras is being blocked by a tree. Need to get Carolina Security out to move the camera.

Fiberglass (gel coat) on bottom of pool is coming up and might need replacing. Daniel will get more information from Aquatech to see if we can get through the next pool season. The coping will most likely need to be replaced before next summer.

Fob activation and deactivation will be transferred to Cedar Management for the 2019 summer season.

Margaret Doherty, C1 Social Chair, in attendance.

End of summer event was on August 24th. Not a huge success, but it was cold that night.

HOA MEETING AGENDA

September 12, 2018

Meeting called to order at 7:00 pm

Motion with second to ratify the August 8 minutes - all in favor, motion passed with one correction: HOA president position not up for re-election in 2019.

OLD BUSINESS

Nothing to report

OFFICER REPORTS

- TREASURER REPORT: Delinquent account balance is \$9,000 in past dues assessments & late fees. There was an increase to the July telephone bill and the July water bill for the Angel Oak monument. Hawthorne will research both increases. Landscape credit received and book in August for July missed mowing. Pool budget finished year with +\$6.00 variance. Financials remain close to budget for the fiscal year to date.
- PRESIDENT REPORT: Conversation continues regarding limiting the number of CII renters. Per Hawthorne
 Management, 8% of current CII homes are rentals. Changes to CII covenants would need to be ratified by a 2/3
 homeowner vote in order to enact renter limitations. Motion with second to table the discussion and gather more
 data all in favor, motion passed.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

- SWIM TEAM: 2018 swim team financials showed a net profit of \$3,441.76. Request of \$2,500 made of CII board for 2019 swim team season. Motion with second to accept the request all in favor, motion passed.
- ARC COMMITTEE: Hawthorne Management reported that 50% of July by-law violations were corrected prior to the August inspection. The board clarified with Hawthorne that there are only two violation letters sent prior to a notice for a hearing.
- SOCIAL COMMITTEE Next event fall festival on October 27th. Expenses split with CI. Motion with second to accept \$5,000 social budget for 2019 all in favor, motion passed. Motion with second to purchase movie screen none in favor, motion opposed.
- **POOL COMMITTEE** Pool closed September 3rd. Hawthorne Management to provide a report on 2018 pool FOB usage to evaluate pool hours of operation and homeowner use.
- LANDSCAPING COMMITTEE Landscape credit received for July. Quarterly landscape report not
 provided prior to the meeting. Hawthorne to research possible irrigation issues at Angel Oak monument that
 could have cause spike in the water bill. Installation of the new playground should commence in September.
- STREET CAPTAINS: Captains have delivered welcome bags to new CII homeowners who moved in between July & August.

NEW BUSINESS

POOL ENHANCEMENTS: CII President met with pool vendors to discuss turning the baby pool into a zero
entry pool with water features. A rough estimate of the cost of the project totaled \$80-\$115,000. Motion with
second to table the project - all in favor, motion passed.



Pool:

Main water line coming into pool was replaced at a cost of \$7,600.

Pressure Reducing Valve installed at a cost of \$268.13. Water pressure in the building was over 140 lbs where normal is 60-70.

Driveway was patched where new water line installed. Cost \$143.77 for materials. Thank you to Cheryl, Jim and Mark! Still need to put down a sealer on replaced parts but will need to wait for cooler weather.

New hose was purchased for the pool. Cost was \$48.25

Need to purchase 2 new handles for shower area at pool.

Dirt mound where water line was installed has been compacted. Thank you, Mark for helping. Will still need to redistribute some of it.

Partial refund on water bill? - Sue will look into further, but first request was denied

Trident Pool Group - a few issues have been addressed.

Pool will only be open Saturdays and Sundays until Sept. 30th, then closed for season. Cheryl closing.

Landscaping:

Damon trimmed bushes and put down new pine straw at pool.

Grass seed where new water lines were installed will be planted in fall after fixing mound of dirt.

Followed up with Meck County about trimming back of bushes along Bradford Hill Lane. Has been completed. Both sides of Bradford Hill have been trimmed back.

Violations:

HO on Fox Tail - Call to hearing at next meeting.

New Oak - still being fined as violations still not corrected as of this afternoon. Fines will continue until violations addressed.

Several other violations noted and notices will be sent out. Will follow up with list next month to make sure all issues have been addressed.

Sue - look into recouping some of excess water expense - first request denied by water company. Will request partial refund again.

A couple of notes for our residents:

Fall is the perfect time to get our yard in shape. Here are a few helpful tips:

- Aerate, seed, and fertilize your lawn (this will help with any bare spots). Once you seed and fertilize wait
 a couple of weeks before you mow again...give the seedlings time to grow securely into the soil!
- Promptly remove any dead plant material located on the lot.
- Regularly mow (about every 10 days during the growing season); <u>edge</u> along curbs, walkways, and drive
 ways; and remove weeds growing in cracks in the driveway, weeds growing in the curb, and in the
 landscape beds.
- Tall Fescue lawns should be moved to a height of 2 1/2 to 3 1/2 inchesIf your shrubs or trees need pruning, now is a good time to get them in shape.
- Installation of pine needles or mulch of choice to landscape beds will add the finishing touch to beds that
 are lacking ground cover or just need a fresh application.

Taking care of and maintaining your yard will improve the overall curb appeal of our neighborhood and our property values. Your HOA is dedicated to maintaining and improving your neighborhood amenities. A special thank you to all those owners who regularly take great care of their yards and home.


