Motion with second to ratify November Regular Session minutes. All in favor. Motion passed.

Annual Meeting reminders will go out around December 16<sup>th</sup>. A copy of the 2019 budget will be included, along with a Nomination Form for the 2 open board positions, and a Proxy Form. Annual meeting is Wednesday, January 16<sup>th</sup> at 7:00pm at Lake Forest Church. WE MUST HAVE A QUORUM (46 HOUSEHOLDS REPRESENTED) TO HOLD THE MEETING.

#### Finance Report:

\$13,748 still outstanding. Please pay your dues!!

As of December 4<sup>th</sup>, Operating Account is at \$37,703.58 and reserves is at \$92,225. The bill for the trees still hasn't come out of the reserves.

The board had a discussion about finalizing the 2019 budget.

Motion with second to approve the 2019 Cedarfield Plantation Budget. All in favor; motion passed.

#### Committee Reports:

ARC - all current

Landscaping

Water geyser at the 8923 Twin Trail was fixed. There is still a water leak from our irrigation system there. Ben has been working with Charlotte Water for 2 months now about it. Charlotte Water came out, but looked at the wrong meter. Ben called back and gave them the correct meter.

No update on work at front entrance monuments. Ben is checking with Superior Landscaping.

Cedar Fall monument update – masonry guy should be starting next week, depending on weather. Once the monument is rebuilt, the electrical will be added. And then the landscaping will be fixed.

Discussed about updating electrical items at all monuments in the future. Also discussed purchasing plug covers for Christmas lights to avoid lights going out when it rains.

Downed lamp post is being replaced. The old post has been removed and a temporary cap has been placed on top of the wires. This is a town owned lamp post, not a Cedarfield owned lamp post.

We requested 12 months of water bill history for the Angel Oak monument from C2, but have not received it yet. The plan is for C1 to take over the water bill on January 1<sup>st</sup>.

Pool

The quote to remove and replace the water line pool tile is \$6400. There will also be a water bill associated with this. The quote for the main pool resurfacing is \$36,900 (new fiberglass lining). Total cost is \$43,300. This quote was brought to us because the fiberglass shell is bubbling up. We are seeking a full inspection and additional quotes for the work before we proceed any further.

Social

Holiday event is Sunday, December 9<sup>th</sup> from 2-4pm in the C2 pool parking lot. There will be Santa, train, hot cocoa bar, cookies, candy canes, crafts, games and prizes.

Christmas lighting went well. The lights for the entire neighborhood used to be organized by a homeowner in C2 who has moved. So each neighborhood will now take care of their own lights, and still come together one day in November to decorate the neighborhood.

There being no further business, a motion was made and there being no objections, the meeting was therefore adjourned.

## HOA MEETING AGENDA

## **December 12, 2018**

Meeting called to order at 7:00 pm

In attendance: Debra Lemmon (President); Jerry Goedert (Vice President); Addy Barton (Member at Large); Kevin LaValley (Maintenance Committee); Susie Call (Pool Committee)

Motion with second to ratify the November minutes - all in favor, motion passed.

#### OLD BUSINESS

Henderson Hill monument water leak: The leak is the responsibility of the City of Huntersville base on work they completed on the water main July 23<sup>rd</sup>. The city is aware that there is still an issue. Hawthorne Management continues to follow-up with the city of the repair timeline.

#### OFFICER REPORTS

- TREASURER REPORT: November financials included repairs done to the pool totaling \$2,535.39 and a landscaping invoice for extra cleanup at the Henderson Hill monument. Dues were increased for 2019 to respond to the rising costs of maintenance and utilities, but also to fund CII's reserve accounts that would fund future improvements and maintenance needs in the coming years. The increase will take effect January 1st. Collection efforts continue on past due accounts. The current outstanding balance is about \$8,000 with \$582.47 collected in November. The HOA will continue to aggressively pursue past due accounts. The November violation hearings levied fines against homes who either failed to attend the hearing or failed to contact Hawthorne Management regarding corrective action. Homes who continue to be in a state of violation are fined on a weekly basis until the violation is corrected and photo documentation is provided to Hawthorne Management by the board.
- PRESIDENT REPORT: A special thank you to all the CI and CII volunteers that help with the "Light-Up Cedarfield" event. The neighborhood looks festive and bright.

#### COMMITTEE REPORTS

- SWIM TEAM: Nothing to report.
- ARC COMMITTEE: Nothing to report.
- SOCIAL COMMITTEE: Next event, Polar Express party at CII pool on December 14.
- POOL COMMITTEE: The board approved \$3,439 in off-season maintenance work to the pool main drains, pump seals and pool cover anchors. Additional work totaling \$8,870 is suggested by Swim Club Management to be completed prior to the spring. The board will discuss his work at the January board meetings
- LANDSCAPING COMMITTEE: Nothing to report.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

The CII Annual Meeting will be held on January 9, 2019 starting at 7:00 pm at 9801 Kincey Ave in the Huntersville Business Park. The annual meeting is a great opportunity for CII homeowners to learn more about the HOA Board and committee membership. The annual meeting is also when new board members are elected. The term for the Vice President and Secretary will be voted on at the January meeting. A quorum of 41 CII homeowners is needed for the vote. A homeowner can either submit their vote at the January 9<sup>th</sup> meeting or by completing the proxy form homeowners will receive via mail in December. If a quorum is not established, the board will appoint members to fill the open spots.

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# Signs Your Dog Is Cold!

Knowing when your dog is cold is key to keeping them comfy and healthy in the winter months. Here are four signs your dog is cold:

- **Hunched and Bunched:** Like us, when dogs are trying to conserve body heat they scrunch up their bodies. They pull their head down, their tail under and they arch their backs. "Miserable" is the caption. Get them inside where it is warm immediately!
- **Shaking:** Like us, dogs tremble and shiver in an effort to get warmer. Some small dogs tremble when nervous as well, so know your dog. But if your dog doesn't normally shake and he is shaking and it's cold? Assume he IS cold. When in doubt, assume he is cold.
- Lifting One Paw Then Another: Cold dogs stand on three feet then shift to lift another paw off the ground.

This can also be a sign that salt is stinging their feet. Either way, they are uncomfortable.

• Doesn't Stretch: Because they are trying to conserve body heat, they don't stretch when they get up from sleeping or come out of a dog house

It is 100% up to us to keep our dogs safe and comfortable year round. If your dog must stay outside in cold weather then get them an insulated dog house that is up to the task! Do not rely on dog coats or sweaters for outside dogs as they can slip off or get wet.





Slow down! Especially on side streets and culde-sacs where children are likely playing. Even 25mph seems awfully fast so please just slow down!




