The Real History Behind

CINCO DE MAYO



For many Americans, Cinco de Mayo means enjoying Mexican food and probably a few margaritas. But Cinco de Mayo, which means the 5th of May in Spanish, is probably one of the most misunderstood Mexican holidays.

Contrary to popular belief, Cinco de Mayo is not Mexico's independence day. Mexican independence is celebrated September 16th. Cinco de Mayo commemorates the Mexican army's unlikely victory over the French forces of Napoleon III on May 5, 1862, at the Battle of Puebla. Mexico had trouble paying back war debts to European countries, and France had come to Mexico to collect that debt.

Today, Cinco de Mayo has become more of an American holiday than a Mexican one. But most non-Mexican Americans have "no idea" about the day's history, said Carlos Tortolero, president of the National Museum of Mexican Art in Chicago.

For Tortolero, Cinco de Mayo is a reminder of how many times Mexico has been invaded by other countries.

"This one day, Mexico won the battle!" remarks Tortolero.

YARD SALE TIPS

The Cedarfield Spring Yard Sale is coming up Saturday, May 4th, starting at 8am. Below are some tips to help you get prepared and make the most of the opportunity!

1. SORT AND ORGANIZE YOUR ITEMS

Go ahead and do the major work ahead of time. Sort your items into three basic categories: Keep, Sell and Trash. Once your piles are made, pull out all of the items you sorted to sell, donate those you don't want and trash what should be trash.

2. HAVE SUPPLIES READY

Make a trip to the bank beforehand to have some bills and coins ready for change. Having a secure place to hold cash is also smart. Price your items ahead of time with simple stickers or even just masking tape and a permanent marker. Have a table and chairs ready in a designated area for you to cash people out. Stock your checkout area with plastic grocery bags and newspaper to wrap up fragile items.

3. BUNDLE ITEMS


It's easy to pass up DVDs at \$1 a pop. But if you offer them at four for \$5, you're sure to catch someone's attention. Look around for ways to make a deal. If it's the end of the day and you really want to move your items, let customers fill up a bag with items for a \$5 or \$10 flat rate.

4. PRICE TO SELL

Don't set the starting price high and expect your customers to haggle you down. Many potential buyers will walk away from big prices and never even bother to haggle—and you just lost a sale. If the customer wants to negotiate, then let them negotiate, but stick to your guns if the price gets too low. You're not giving your stuff away! Well, not yet anyway.

5. SET UP SMART

The morning of the sale, get up early and do a little setting up. Make sure whatever you're selling looks attractive and your signs are visible. Put your more interesting items closer to the street so people know you're selling more than just T-shirts, costume jewelry, and old coffee mugs. For everything else, keep it organized, clearly priced, and easy to sort through. Those small touches will go a long way!

SKILLET BLACKBERRY COBBLER

Fresh blackberries are currently on sale. This is a family favorite & great for Memorial Day too!

INGREDIENTS:

1/2 cup (113 grams) unsalted butter, melted and cooled

1 1/4 cup + 2 tablespoons (275 grams) granulated sugar divided

1 cup (120 grams) all-purpose flour

1 1/2 teaspoon baking powder

1/2 teaspoon salt1 cup (225 ml) whole milk

3 cups (430 grams) blackberries, fresh or frozen

Vanilla ice cream or whipped cream, for serving (optional

DIRECTIONS:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F and grease skillet

Mix 1 cup of the sugar, the flour, baking powder, and salt. Add the milk and combine. Add the melted butter and whisk until smooth

Pour the batter into the greased baking dish. Scatter the top with all of the blackberries. Sprinkle 1/4 cup of sugar over the top.

Bake until edges are golden and crispy, 50-60 minutes. When 10 minutes remain (topping is just turning golden), sprinkle with remaining 2 tablespoons sugar.

Serve warm with whipped cream or ice cream

Motion with second to ratify the March minutes - all in favor, motion passed.

OFFICER REPORTS:

TREASURER REPORT:

- · Financials for March were as expected.
- There was one large expense for pool repairs required prior to opening.
- We have only processed 2 monthly invoices from our landscaper, so we expect a large landscaping expense next month as we get caught up for the
 vear
- · Collections are going well, and we continue to monitor homes that are not current with their assessments.
- Pre-lien letters will be sent to several homes that have not paid any dues in 2019.
- We will look at reserve allocation to determine the best way to disperse money to our reserve accounts. Currently the bulk is going to a general reserve account instead of the specific accounts we have for specific needs. Changes will be made for go-forward allocations only.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

- ARC Committee: 3 new ARC requests that were approved, 2 for fences and 1 for painting.
- Social Committee: The Easter festival was a success and we had a great turn out. Thank you to the Social Committee for putting this event together... WANT TO BE PART OF THE FUN? The Social Committee is still seeking additional volunteers!
- **Pool Committee:** It was brought to Sue Sinks attention that the C2 buy in for the pool was increased in 2018 from \$50-\$75 for C1 residents. As such, the board approved to maintain the cost of \$75 for 2019. The addition of a \$25 (5 time) punch card for the pool for visitors of CII homeowners was approved. There are now 2 options for bringing guests to the pool. The vinyl siding needs to be repaired on the peak of the pool house, and has been sent out for a quote. Prepping for pool opening should be complete by 5/19.
- Landscape/Maintenance: The landscaping company has sprayed for weeds and will continue to work to improve the appearance of all major monuments. A quote will be sent out for a drain pipe issue down by the creek bed, and for the removal of the Indian Hawthorns that are ruminants of the previous trees. The board is working to make a decision by May for flower options for all 7 monuments for planting. All pruning and pine straw throughout the neighborhood will be completed by the end of April.

HISTORY IN HUNTERSVILLE



Hugh Torance House & Store are located just west of the Gilead entrance to Cedarfield.

You've likely driven by the historic site right on our doorstep many times but have you ever stopped to visit? Bring along the family and experience antebellum life. The historic Hugh Torance House and Store is North Carolina's oldest surviving store and one of Mecklenburg County's few surviving 18th century structures.

Located in Huntersville, North Carolina, the house and mercantile establishment is a true historical treasure. The log house section of the building was built as a residence around 1779. In 1805 the building was expanded to include a store which operated until 1825. As the Torance (later changed to Torrence then Torrance) family obtained land and wealth, it became a cotton plantation of 3,000 acres worked by over a hundred slaves. Extensive family history kept through generations allows us to interpret nearly a century of Mecklenburg's rich mercantile and plantation history. Tours run from April through October, on every 1st and 3rd Sunday. Visit and experience life as it was in antebellum Mecklenburg County.

Parking is free. There is a suggested donation for admission of \$5.
